UCR History & Overview

- Replaced the Single State Registration System (SSRS)
 - SSRS was created in the early 1990's
- Establishes a lower compliance burden for carriers
- Provides same level of revenue to the states
- Registration is good in all 50 states
- All registrations are completed online
- 41 participating states (revenue entitlements)



Unified Carrier Registration Act of 2005

The Act

Public Law 109-59, Title IV, §4305(b), August 10, 2005; Title 49 – Transportation - USC §14504a

- The Act created the UCR Plan, and:
 - Provisioned a UCR Agreement (By-Laws)
 - Identified the entities subject to The Act
 - Established a governance board



Unified Carrier Registration Act of 2005

- Requires motor carriers operating commercial motor vehicles (CMV's) in interstate or international commerce, and other businesses subject to The Act, to:
 - Register on-line with UCR
 - Pay annual fees
- Fees are based on fleet size
- <u>Purpose</u>: To provide level funding to states while reducing the compliance burden on motor carriers



The UCR Plan & Agreement

- The UCR Plan is the organization of state, federal and industry representatives responsible for developing, implementing and administering the UCR Agreement
- The UCR Agreement governs the collection and distribution of registration information and fees generated under the UCR Plan



Entities Subject to The Act

- Entities subject to UCR include:
 - Motor carriers (and private motor carriers)
 - Brokers
 - Freight forwarders
 - Leasing companies



Commercial Motor Vehicle (CMV)

• Definition of a Commercial Motor Vehicle for UCR purposes:

- A self-propelled vehicle used on the highways in commerce principally to transport passengers or cargo
 - Has a gross vehicle weight rating or gross vehicle weight of at least 10,001 pounds, whichever is greater, or when connected to trailing equipment has a gross combination weight rating or gross combination weight of at least 10,001 pounds, whichever is greater
 - Carries placarded amounts of hazardous materials, regardless of the vehicle's weight,
 - Is designed to carry more than 10 passengers, including the driver.



Governance – Board of Directors

- Appointed by US Secretary of Transportation (or designee)
 - 5 state members nominated by NCSTS*
 - 4 state members from FMCSA** Regions
 - 5 Industry members
 - 1 member from FMCSA

3-year terms, no limits on number of terms

- * NCSTS National Conference of State Transportation Specialists
- ** FMCSA Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration

Units leased for more than 30 days are to be counted in the lessee's fleet of vehicles for the purpose of UCR.

NOTE: Fees for the 2023 registration year are currently under federal review but are expected to be significantly less than the fees for the 2020 – 2022 registration years.

UCR Depository

- Depository created by The Act
- Collects substantially all fees remitted by registrants
- Distributes fees from participating states that exceed their revenue entitlements to those states that do not
- All 41 participating states have achieved their entitlements since 2014, in great part due to Depository Distributions



Selecting a Base State

- Entities subject to the requirements of the UCR program are also subject to:
- The requirement to register with the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA)
- File FMCSA's Form MCS-150 or MCSA-1 and obtain a DOT number.
- Identify a "principal address." For purposes of UCR:
 - this location is the registrant's "principal place of business,"
 - If the registrant's principal place of business is in a state that participates in UCR, that state is the entity's base state
 - Otherwise select a base state nearest to the principal place of business
 - Base state is recipient of revenues collected by the UCR Plan

Enforcement

- Enforcement is a State responsibility
- Typically begins on January 1
- Penalties and fines accrue to the issuing state in addition to the UCR fee entitlement

Carrier Audits by States

- Participating states required to conduct annual audit of carriers for previous UCR registration year
- States review carriers that have retreated from a higher fee bracket to a lower bracket
